India's Andaman Islands!

Meeting @ 7 PM; Speaker @ 8 PM!

The Andamans consist of over 300 relatively unexplored islands located in the Bay of Bengal and the Andaman Sea to the west of Myanmar (formerly, Burma) and close to Phuket, Thailand. Virgin rainforests, reefs and caves await. The water is warm and clear, with plentiful marine life. Geologically, the Islands are subject to earthquakes, volcanic eruptions and the occasional tsunami. Politically, the Islands have been used as prison colonies as early as 1789, first by the Government of Bengal, then by the British, and, finally, by the Japanese, who occupied the territory during the Second World War. These Islands are also home to five indigenous tribes, including a primitive, very aggressive people, the Sentinelese, whose first friendly contact with outsiders came only as recently as 1991. All of this combines to provide the intrepid traveler with very fertile ground – and water – in which to explore. **Bernie Chowdhury**, DAN, NAUI, PADI and TDI Instructor, a popular and engaging speaker who has presented at dive shows, shops and clubs throughout the US, & in eight foreign countries, is a favorite with the KDA! He is best known for his critically acclaimed, international top-selling book, *The Last Dive*, (non-fiction, HarperCollins, 2000) which has been published in eleven languages and an audio version. An e-book release is pending. He was the founder and co-publisher for nine years of immersed international diving magazine & has been editor of *Historical Diver* and also the Canadian-based *DIVER* magazines. He has published numerous articles in various magazines. He has worn many hats during his 27 years in diving, including: Recreational and technical instructor, expedition organizer, industry consultant, and documentary co-producer, to name a few. Bernie has been a Fellow of the Explorers Club since 1995 and has led and/or participated in ground-breaking expeditions in both wreck and cave diving. He has been a board-certified hyperbaric medical technologist (CHT) since 2004 and remains active in several capacities in the hyperbaric medical field. Bernie was named Beneath the Sea's 2001 Diver of the Year for Education. He is an active technical diving instructor, teaching courses up to and including Advanced Trimix; and also Advanced Wreck (Penetration).

Last KDA Meeting: May 4, 2011!

Our scheduled presentation, *The Future of our Underwater Past*, was left in the computer of Pat Clyne, so **Peter E. Hessquire**, ever the opportunist that he is, and being as how Mike Dudas HAD dug up a 1985 publicity photo of him, decided to wow us with some slides (*you remember THEM, don't you?*) of the *Atocha* from that era in honor of Pat Clyne's new book, *The Atocha Odyssey*. (*Why not drop by DDD and pick up a copy!*) So back to 1985 we went, the year that Mel Fisher uncovered the Motherlode off the Florida Keys and Peter got to spend a few weeks helping out. Everybody wanted a piece of the action then – but only the investors received that 1,200% on their investment! Always traveling in groups for protection from buccaneers, the *Atocha* was part of a convoy of sailing vessels returning to Spain loaded with treasure from Mexico and the New World when she sunk in a hurricane that September of 1622. Unfortunately a 2nd hurricane scattered the wreckage some 9 ½ nautical miles along the sea floor making the task of recovery a “needle in the haystack” operation. Replicating a castle with a high, cumbersome bow and stern, these galleons were handy for fending off pirates, but lousy for sailing against the wind. She left Havana too late to avoid the storms and broke her belly on a reef and sunk – 265 people perished and 5 who had tied themselves into the mast survived to tell the tale. And so began the search. From the site of the wreck there are only 3 of the Marqueses Keys visible, thus the description from the survivors which threw them off – there were really many more islands there. A good indicator of a wreck would be a pile of ballast stone – round river stone from the ships origin. Another landmark would be pottery. Olive jars were the 55-gallon drum of the day. The neck of these earthenware jugs is the most telling place of origin. And speaking of necks, the lovely chain worn around that of the Queen of Spain in her portrait gives a whole new meaning to the term “treasure chest.” Many of the passengers wore their gold in the form of huge chains – so they wouldn't be taxed – only gold bars were taxed. These made for great tax evasion, but lousy as life preservers. The first traces of the *Atocha* were found in 1971. They drug that magnetometer over many, many miles of ocean in search of the iron in the wreck; however, 99 out of 100 hits were bombs from a FL WWII bombing range! In 1985 when the stash of silver ingots, timbers and gold bars was found, they filed an admiralty arrest of the wreck; that is where the court determines who owns and who has a right to the wreck. Based on the archeologists' findings and theories, it looks like Mel Fisher was the winner this time! And based on this revisit to Peter's 1985 adventure, it looks like we were, too! **Andrew Nagle** captured the 50-50 (*and, thanks, donated it back to the club!*) **SEA U 6-1-11 at Barnaby's!!**

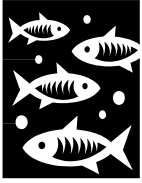
