"Is Deep Water Salvage Truly in Deep Water?"

Next year marks the 100th anniversary of the world's most famous shipwreck, RMS TITANIC. Collections of the incredible artifacts salvaged from her wreck have toured the world and enthralled millions. Yet the efforts spearheaded by the US State Dept and NOAA seek passage of a treaty "protecting" the disintegrating TITANIC site from further artifact recovery.

After spending millions of dollars and deploying state of the art technology, a US company finds and recovers 500,000 Spanish silver coins from deep international waters, only to be ordered to "return" the treasure to the King of Spain.

UNESCO--the United Nations Educational, Scientific & Cultural Organization--has passed an international convention outlawing any buying, selling or trading of "underwater cultural heritage" (shipwreck artifacts to you and I), instead proclaiming everything of value lying undiscovered underwater to be government property. Wreck divers and shipwreck salvors are condemned as "the destroyers of our past".

How do such asinine proposals become law and what can be done by divers and explorers to ensure our right to continue to search for and recover historic shipwrecks? Wreck diver and maritime attorney Peter Hess takes us to the front lines of deep water exploration and discovery--and the inevitable battles over the future of our underwater past.

Last KDA Meeting: April 6, 2011!

One hundred forty-four miles of barrier reef due north of New Guinea, considered the Gibraltar of the Pacific – with air strips constructed by Trukese slave labor, this collection of roads, trenches, bunkers and caves looking out on the Japanese Imperial Fleet at anchor is Truk Lagoon acquired thru the League of Nations by the Japanese after WWI. Now in WWII, the US had won the nearby Marshall Islands in battle and was assembling forces in preparation for a raid on Truk, so the Japanese set about moving their giant battleships, aircraft carriers, and landing craft out of the Lagoon. But before they could move any of their support craft, in the early morning of February 17th, 1944, at the height of the war in the Pacific, United States Naval forces launched a daring air raid codenamed "Operation Hailstone" on the Japanese military stronghold of Truk Lagoon in Micronesia. As a result of the raid more than 270 Japanese planes were destroyed and 50 support ships sent to the bottom of the lagoon. More than 65 years later the Shipwrecks of Truk have become a Mecca for sport divers. **Mike Gerken** who lived and worked in Truk Lagoon 2003 until 2008 as crew member of the *Truk Aggressor* and later the captain of the *Truk Odyssey* has amassed one of the largest collections of underwater video, archival film and still images ever assembled. He spent four years producing this documentary on Truk Lagoon and an hour sharing it with us! Virtually no current, but very deep, makes for a technical dive dreamland! It's a full-cycle display: #5 beer bottles and urinals in this virtual underwater museum as the removal of the many relics and artifacts enriched in marine life is illegal – they WILL check your luggage when you leave the country. At 160' and the deck at 130' the bridge and telegraph of the *Nippo Maru* are quite prominent with battle tanks at the ready and the anti tank guns still have their tires! The *Rio de Janiero Maru* had been a Japanese diesel passenger cruise ship before taken by the Japanese Army – her last stop was Rio! She lies from 35' - 110' just waiting to have her engine room explored. Filmed during the 2007 DDD tour, EBD was seen cruising the *Amagisan Maru* in 140' – 200' of clear blue water; a set of fins marked "Jeb" clearly occupied the foreground. Rodney and Susie Dudas Cairn were seen scooting the entire 385' stem to stern of the \$million wreck, the *San Francisco Maru*; an impressive sight as they moved quickly over equipment on the 160' deck and munitions below – she lies in 210 feet. If you still want to explore the wrecks of Truk and aren't technical, there are plenty of shallow wrecks as well, they just won't be called on by TEAM DDD. Mike's documentary brings the historical significance to light and ties in the actual battles to the wrecks the divers are exploring. In the USS Tang Rescue, the most daring rescue of WWII, 22 downed pilots and crew adrift in rubber rafts precariously close to the reefs were rescued by the sub – which later sailed back to Hawaii. Kingfisher seaplanes, flying precariously close to the Japs, were also used in rescue – with so many men on one wing (oh, I have that problem, too) she was damaged and unable to fly – so she was sent to the bottom after all were safely on board the Tang so as not to fall into enemy hands. The more than 500 planes of the US forces took out 95% of the Japanese merchant fleet and 6 warships. In the weeks before the Japanese had moved the warships out of the area for protection and in fact the history books had put little emphasis on this battle because they did not score many war ships. However, in the grand scheme of things, this WAS the ultimate battle because those warships couldn't operate at all without their supply ships of the merchant fleet! Thanks to Kimeo, the Blue Lagoon has the best real museum. **Mike Gerken** has since returned to Morehead City, North Carolina and rejoined with Olympus Dive Center in April of 2009. He captains the 48' *Midnight Express* run by Olympus Dive Center. **Patti Pittock** captured the 100-100 (*that's when you win back to back 50-50's*). **SEA U 5-4-11 at Barnaby's!!**

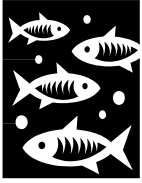

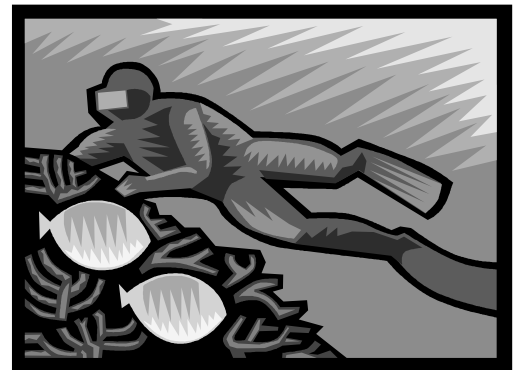
